

### The Laughing Buddha

ver so often I see variety of Laughing Buddhas placed in people's homes. Some of them are colourful while some are simple. The most common belief about this statue is that it attracts wealth and prosperity. The beliefs attached to this statue are many and some are indeed strange. In my opinion, the Laughing Buddha seems to have more cultural significance than any real Feng Shui history attached to it. So does it mean you cannot display a Laughing Buddha by the entrance?

Of course you can. If you feel happy looking at the statue and think it's going to bring you good luck – then go right ahead. If you believe that your life will improve by displaying the statue, then it's the right thing to do. Just remember – the effect is more psychological and it's not a real Feng Shui cure.
